2014 Membership of Patrington Cricket Club and Important Latest News

Please find enclosed your application form to become a Full or Junior Member of Patrington Cricket Club, for the period 1 April 2014 to 31 March 2015.

As agreed at the AGM, following the suspension of the fantasy cricket competition this season (due to reduced entrants), the annual subscription has been increased to £30 (£20 for unemployed / under 18s). Whilst the Committee regrets having to increase subscription fees, they're a vital source of club income, required to help cover the costs of running the club. Many clubs charge £100+ annual subscription, so our fees still represent tremendous value for money, especially when considering the high standards of cricket facilities and equipment at our Southside ground. To be available for selection, please pay your subscription by no later than **Friday 25 April 2014**.

Introducing your senior leagues and captains:

Ian Buss has been appointed **1st XI** (and club) captain, with Ian selecting the experienced and once captain, Marc Pollard, as his vice-captain. Ian has played and captained at a higher standard than any cricketer at our club, having led a team out at Lords, and is looking forward to the challenge of taking our first team and club to a similarly high standard, at our very own Lords of the North. The **1st XI** will play in YDSCL Division 2 (South) in the coming season, alongside the likes of Beverley Town II, Hornsea, Hull II, Welton and Hull Zingari II, whom will all be vying for just one promotion spot to Division 1. Our club could only have dreamt of being in such a position just five years ago, when such competing teams were at such an incredibly higher standard and only a few thought Patrington would ever be accepted into the YDSCL. However, YDSCL premier league cricket at Southside is now within sight, possibly as close as just two seasons away, but it'll certainly be a challenging season ahead for Ian's team.

Glenn Ratcliffe returns to captaining the **2nd XI**, who will play in Division 4 (East) of YDSCL alongside the former EYCA Premier stalwarts of Beverley III, Cottingham, Kirkella, South Holderness and Sutton, but joined by Hornsea II as well as bygone era competitors Brandesburton. Promotion to Division 3 (South) in 2014 could be rewarded with day trips to Pickering and Scarborough, so plenty of spectators will be hoping the 2nds put in their best season yet.

Meanwhile, **Will Ineson** continues as our **3rd XI** captain, following a great debut season in charge. Having entered the YDSCL Eastern Conference at Division 4, the team will play all its home games on Sundays in 2014, against the likes of Beeford, Hornsea III, Hull III and Hutton Cranswick (the latter amongst former **1st XI** opposition). This forward move negates having to invest further in the playing fields, enabling the Club to invest in just one cricket ground for the foreseeable future and, importantly, affording **3rd XI** players, whether seasoned veterans or junior, the opportunity to don their whites at Southside. The move will also mean that up to nine additional games will be played at Southside, providing the opportunity for increased club funds and for **1st** and **2nd** team players, and social members, to offer their support and encouragement from the sidelines.

Whichever team you happen to play for this year, please respect your captains, who have been elected by you, both to select teams and be ultimately responsible for our club on the pitch. It's important that all members comply with both the club's and leagues' code of conducts and, importantly, that you respect the captains' wishes, both on and off the pitch. Let's make sure we continue to improve (and not damage) the club's reputation in cricketing circles.

A great opportunity to further improve:

With the integration of the EYCA league clubs into the YDSCL, we have the opportunity to play at the highest possible level with locally-sourced talent, at a truly beautiful setting - for generations to come. It was agreed at the AGM that we should try to raise funding and secure grants so that we can extend our clubhouse at the end of the 2014 season. This will enable us to install new toilet facilities in the clubhouse, for use by spectators and players, and expand and improve the tearoom and bar area, into a comfortable and relaxing area to watch cricket, through new patio doors, and to socialize after the match.

But, all this costs money and requires resource. So, please do take a little bit of your time to help our club raise funds, and encourage your family members and friends to help us to do so, whether by being a matchball sponsor (and therefore becoming a social member) or by volunteering a few hours of their time in our tearoom.

Social media: We'll be sharing more details of how you can get involved, on our new facebook and twitter accounts, in the coming weeks. Please visit and like our facebook page, and follow us on twitter, so that you'll automatically receive club alerts in due course, including the opportunity to win prizes in raffles and competitions.

Bonus ball: A great, easy way to help us raise funds is for you or friends and family members to join our club's bonus ball competition. We currently have more non-players than players in the bonus ball competition. Katie Purden has done an excellent job of securing more than 50 participants, but there's still an opportunity to more than double our bonus ball players, so please read and complete the enclosed application form for the competition.

Tearoom rota: Another sure way of helping us to raise club funds is to have our tearoom permanently manned during home fixtures, so players, travelling supporters and spectators may buy refreshments during the game. We sometimes take more than £100 profit per match. There are around 30 league fixtures at Southside this summer, not to mention the cup fixtures which will be played, so an opportunity to raise more than £3,000 for clubhouse improvements. Please can every player make an effort to ask loved ones if they'd be prepared to do a home fixture on our attached rota - if so, please put the volunteer's name on our rota in the tearoom. At the end of the season, we'll be holding a tearoom volunteer raffle at the presentation night, where each volunteer (that has spent more than four hours manning a tearoom on a match-day) will have a chance to win the first prize of £100 (donated by myself) – if a volunteer does 2 match days, they'll have 2 entries into the raffle, 3 tickets for 3 matches, etc.

Please do help support our club this season - to have a clubhouse that matches the quality of our ground. Lastly, as always, may I wish you another very enjoyable season, whether it's with bat, ball, behind the stumps, in the field or indeed watching. Here's to a great summer at Southside and best wishes to all Patrington CC members.
